

Gahanna-Jefferson Master Facilities Planning: A Collaborative Design Process



All sessions listed below will be held in the Gahanna Lincoln High School library, located at 140 S. Hamilton Road.



Sat., Jan. 30, 9 - 11 a.m.

The first step in the process is to understand the purpose and mission of the district, and to **envision** how this can be applied to the built environment. This is a time to dream about the potential of the educational environment for the students, and for the community.



Sat., Feb. 27, 9 - 11:30 a.m.

The second step is to **define** the program of the project, both quantitatively and qualitatively. We'll list the spaces that are required for the district and develop a preliminary budget to assist in setting priorities.



Thurs., March 17, 6:30 - 9 p.m.

The third step is a collaborative design, and test fit of all the facility options for the district. This can be reallocation of space within an existing facility, additions and alterations, and/or new facilities. During this step all possibilities are **considered**, factoring in priorities of the program, goals set for the project, and the analysis of the site. This is where we begin to solve the puzzle, evaluating pros and cons.



Tues., April 26, 6:30 - 9 p.m.

The fourth step is where purpose is **transformed** into place. Through a consensus building process, the community will select the preferred option that best meets the needs, mission, and budget of the district.
