2. **Panorama - Discussed by Jill Elliott**

- We sent a letter in October to families with information about the Panorama survey we are using in the district this year.
- This survey is a tool that has allowed us to collect perception data on social-emotional needs of students and learn about student perceptions regarding topics such as school climate, sense of belonging, emotional regulation, and social awareness.
- There is also a teacher survey that we are using to help us understand more about how our staff is feeling with regards to school climate, resources and supports and overall job satisfaction which is very important to the work they do with our students every day.

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- We have begun analyzing this data as an administrative team and working on plans for rolling it out to our teachers.
- We are focusing in on students' sense of belonging and are really working with our staff on action steps to help our students feel connected and to have meaningful experiences during their time with us.

Nationwide Children's Hospital gave a very informative presentation at Middle School West regarding the signs of suicide.

 - The different theatre classes perform various holiday skits, songs, dances and comedy routines ---usually very tongue in cheek. Skits are written and performed by the students.
- Holiday Band Concert Sunday, December 15th at 5 pm in the GLHS auditorium.
 - Admission is free
 - This concert will feature the Blue, Silver, and Gold Bands performing holiday and non-holiday music. The stage will be decorated with poinsettias and lights in celebration of the season, and one of the highlights will include Blue Band's performance of *'Twas the Night Before Christmas* with narration, music, and projected illustrations.

B. TREASURER'S REPORT

1. **General Fund Summary Update:** Revenues totaled \$45.4 million as of November 30, a 14.7 percent increase compared to last year at this time. It also equals about 47 percent of total revenues projected for the fiscal year. Real estate revenue collection resulting from the 2018 operating levy passage continues to drive the increase. Expenditures totaled \$40.1 million, with \$39.7 being operational expenditures. Operational expenditures are tracking 4.6 percent above last year at this time. Salaries are up 3.2 percent due to negotiated increases and staffing needs. Benefits are up 8.9 percent based on the wage increase and the medical insurance increase.

Purchased Services are up by 7.9 percent. I should draw the Board's attention to two related areas within purchased services with which we are having issues. The first is an increase in Peterson and Autism scholarships. These are State voucher programs that deduct funds from our State

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Foundation funding. These deductions have increase by \$355,000 from last year as a result of an increase of 15.4 FTEs from the two programs. Additionally, there has been an unexpected increase in special ed move-ins and foster placements requiring outside services. Sue Wieging is working up an amount needed to be added to her budget. I would anticipate that an amendment to the appropriations will be needed to cover these additional costs.
